3. STUDENT FUNDING

3.1 England and Wales

a. Department of Health Bursaries

Students on qualifying radiography courses are normally funded by Department of Health bursaries. The student normally applies for these through the radiography education centre at which the course is to be studied. Bursary amounts are assessed individually by the Department of Health to take account of income and personal circumstances and of the length of terms and vacations.

b. Local Education Authority Mandatory Awards

Where bursaries are not available from Health Authority sources applicants are advised to apply for a grant to their Local Education Authority (i.e. where you reside permanently) since degree courses are eligible for Mandatory awards.

3.2 Scotland

Students normally resident in Scotland should apply for funding to the Students Award Agency for Scotland, Gyleview House, 3 Redheughs Rigg, Edinburgh, EH12 9HH.

3.3 Northern Ireland

Students should apply to their local education authority for a mandatory award.
